

## Summary of September 25, 2008 Presbytery meeting

On a beautiful fall day, Presbyters met at St. Andrew's United Church in Harvey Station. The outgoing chair, Elaine White, constituted the Court and then installed the new executive.

Rev. Meredith Fraser, new chair, resumed the meeting. Three new members of the Clergy were welcomed to the Court: Rev. Keith Adams-Centreville Pastoral Charge; Rev. Kelly Burke-New Maryland Pastoral Charge; Rev. Jane Johnson-Gagetown-Grand Lake Pastoral Charge. During the worship service, which was held before lunch, a Covenanting service was held. Those with whom Presbytery was covenanting were: Rev. Tom Robinson, Plaster Rock, Grand Falls, Riley Brook Pastoral Charge; Rev. Franklin Curtis, Nashwaak Pastoral Charge; Rev. Brian MacDonald, Lincoln Pastoral Charge; Rev. Boyce Martin, Kingsley-Birdton Pastoral Charge and Helena Medeiros, Doaktown Pastoral Charge.

An important notice from the Correspondence was the letter to all Pastoral Charges regarding the changes in the Housing Allowance.

All committees had a great deal of business to report. One of the important highlights of the Heritage and Resources report was a Power Point presentation on property within the Presbytery. Christian Life and Growth had an excellent report on the Camping season. However, there remains a short fall in funds and an appeal has been made to congregations for assistance.

Fred has been an active member of the Pastoral Care team and will be leaving shortly to begin a new ministry in Halifax.

Presbyters accepted the resignation of Rev. Peter Short of Wilmot United Church. Peter will be retiring from active Ministry at the end of November.
