Alma Brookes, of Saint Mary's First Nations welcomed the Court to the 'land' with song. The Court was divided into 3 groups for discussion. The first question "as a practicing Christian, with your skills and financial resources, what strategy would you use to make a difference in God's world. Second, sharing Our knowledge and resources, making decisions together, we are empowered to transform problems into a better world. What strategy or combination of ideas do you feel the church should follow and why? The last question, on the withdrawal of funding for Kairos, provoked much discussion and 3 motions were presented to the Court. These were combined into the following: that Presbytery write to Minister Bev Oda; the Prime Minister and copy Cabinet members asking that her decision be reconsidered referring to the recommendation from CIDA as background; and that background information on Kairos be put on the Presbytery web site so that individuals and congregations would be encouraged to write letters, particularly to their Members of Parliament.

Committee reports followed. Church In Action reminded the Court that some funding was available for 2 young people to attend Rendez-vous 2011. This event is for youth Grade 9 and up. Applications are due in March. Pastoral Relations presented several motions, all were approved and appear in the minutes. Stewardship certificates were presented to several congregations by Barb Kelly, Stewardship convenor. Certificates were also presented to members of clergy who had attended Racial Justice workshops. Approval was given to the requests from Camp Woolastook and Kirk United Church to apply for grants. The report from Camp Woolastook included information about the extensive damage due to the floods and plans for the repairs. Helena Medieros will be a Candidate for Ordination at the Maritime Conference meetings in May. Registration forms for Maritime Conference were distributed to those in attendance.
